Principal's Message - What do you like about Christmas?

We pull the decorations out from storage, put them up, think about them for a few weeks during this season. We eat a lot of candy canes, drink eggnog and seasonal coffees, but after a while, we take the decorations down, package them all away, stores stop selling the seasonal foods and drinks, and we forget about it for a while.

Is that sometimes how we treat Jesus?

So easily we tend to pack away the message of Jesus, we forget just how impactful it is on our lives. This event in our world's history, God made flesh, the baby born in Bethlehem, is the most powerful message that anyone can share.

To remember how impactful this message is, let's remind ourselves of who we are....


