Message from the Principal - The Next Generation: Gen Z

- 3. Inclusive (have seen the hate, bigotry, etc. of the older generations, preach acceptance)
- 4. In no hurry (getting married later in 20s, kids in 30s)
- 5. Insecure (told they need to make a mark on the world, social media allows them to compare)

6. Irreligious (least religious generation in 250 years, 1 in 3 pray or go to church)


About Teachers Are Heroes

This year, the Azusa Pacific University's Teachers are Heroes Award celebrates 18 years of recognizing dedicated and inspirational Public, Charter and Private Elementary School Teachers across San Diego County. San Diego County has 780 schools and 120 charter schools, 42 school districts serving more 500,000 students. In all, there are more than 23,000 public school teachers throughout the County. And only 12 are recognized as the Azusa Pacific University's Teachers Are Hero Award recipient in 2019-20. Every year, more than 150 nomination letters are submitted to the Selection Committee. Each letter is carefully reviewed utilizing criteria on how a teacher displays inspiration, enthusiasm, service and is respected by students, teachers and colleagues and parents. When a teacher is selected, with the help of the San Diego County Office of Education, representatives of Azusa Pacific University and the radio station make a formal "surprise" presentation to our honored teacher.

As an appreciation, each honored Teacher receives a gift card to purchase school supplies for their classroom; a classroom lunch party and an end-of-school year Teacher celebration featuring more than 800 students from across San Diego County at LEGOLAND California Resort.


